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**Day 1 – Grand River, KY - Dinner at Patt’s Settlement** - Welcome Aboard! The first day of our trip to Music City USA will only take us as far as Patti’s Settlement in Grand Rivers, Kentucky. We check into our overnight accommodations and then enjoy dinner. After dinner take a stroll through the settlement to view the beautiful gardens. **(D)**

**Day 2 – Nashville, TN – General Jackson Lunch Cruise - Madame Tussaud's Country Music Wax Museum – Two Nights Gaylord Opryland Hotel** - After breakfast this morning take one last stroll around the Settlement. Late morning finds us arriving in Nashville just in time to board the General Jackson for the luncheon cruise.

Then visit Madame Tussaud's Country Music Wax Museum and have your picture taken with Country Music Legends. In 90 minutes, you will immerse yourself into the lifestyle of country music and enjoy history in the making.

End the day by checking into the Gaylord Opryland Hotel for a two night stay. Situated in the heart of Nashville, Gaylord Opryland Resort welcomes you to a stunning resort experience. From SoundWaves, the city’s premier aquatic attraction, to an exciting lineup of activities and entertainment, there’s something for the entire family to enjoy. Guests at our Opryland hotel suites can explore nine acres of airy indoor garden atriums, award-winning restaurants and bars, the world-class Relâche Spa and a state-of-the-art fitness center. Dinner is on your own this evening. **(B,L)**

**Day 3 - Nashville Troubadour Tour – Ryman Auditorium – Free Time at Fifth + Broadway – Grand Old Opry 100th Birthday Show** – Following breakfast this morning, meet your local guide for a Troubadour City Tour. This Singer/Song Writer Guided City Tour is an "Only in Nashville" kind of experience. Bringing new meaning to the phrase "Entertaining Narrative" it's sightseeing with a singer/songwriter guide. The tour will include Downtown Nashville's colorful history with drive-bys of the historic Ryman Auditorium, Tootsie's Orchid Lounge, Honky Tonk Row. You will hear what it's like trying to break into Nashville's music scene, both the struggles and the victories.

Then enjoy a Guided Tour of the Ryman Auditorium and learn the history of this famous building. If available they may also be able to take you backstage for a brief look into how the Stars get ready before they perform. This is only if they don't have a venue that day. Known as the “Mother Church of Country Music,” the Ryman Auditorium has been one of the country’s premiere concert venues for more than 100 years. Established in 1892 as the Union Gospel Tabernacle, Ryman Auditorium is a National Historic Landmark and a must see for any Nashville visitor. Most famous as the home of the Grand Ole Opry from 1943 — 1974, there is far more to the story of Music City’s most recognizable icon.

Next, enjoy free time and lunch on your own at Fifth + Broadway’s Assembly Food Hall high above the Ryman Auditorium with a view of the city. This European-style market with casual dining both indoor and open air. With eats and entertainment for all ages, this venue is changing the way Nashville lives, works, and plays. Enjoy premier shopping & good food at Apple Store, Ariat, Free People,

Hattie B’s, Shake Shack, Slim & Husky’s and much more all while taking in the downtown views.

This evening, dinner is included at the Back Stage Grill manager by the Grand Ole Opry. The restaurant serves signature Southern Cooking paired perfectly with Live Country Music. Here your love of food and your love of music will meet in this casually cool restaurant. And at the Opry Backstage Grill, your waitress might even jump on the stage and sing a country favorite or two.

After dinner, see a performance of the Grand Ole Opry celebrating its 100th Birthday. For 100 Years, country’s best performers have mesmerized audiences at the Grand Ole Opry Live Radio Show, the show that made country music famous. Each Opry show features an array of performances by new stars, superstars and legends of country music as well as great bluegrass, comedy and more. Opry shows are never rehearsed and never the same show twice. **(B,D)**

**Day 4 – Cape Girardeau, MO – Guided City Tour - Heritage Museum & Crisp Museum** - After an included breakfast, we say good bye to Nashville and make our way to Cape Girardeau, MO. Upon our arrival, we will be joined by a local guide who will share with us how this town evolved from a tiny trading post 200 years ago to a thriving community. Lunch is on your own at Port Cape. Afternoon will find us visiting the Heritage Museum and Crisp Museum. Tonight, enjoy the hotel’s kick back reception with your traveling friends. **(B, Kick Back Reception)**

**Day 5 – St. Louis, MO – National Blues Museum - Depart for Home** - Breakfast is included before we check out and board our motorcoach. This is the last day of our tour but it is not over yet. We still have time to stop in St. Louis to visit the National Blues Museum. This museum is dedicated to exploring the musical history and impact of the blues. Arrival back home will be early evening... memories and all. **(B)**
